	Using AI applications to debug and check for security updates in our network.	Asking an AI tool for scientific information when a guest asks a question that is hard to answer.
	Using the Canva or Adobe AI tools to create a flyer or social media post.	Translating a question from a guest when someone who speaks their language is not available.
	Creating an HR AI agent/bot that can answer non-sensitive questions such as where can I find my benefits or who do I talk to about...	Brainstorming ideas for an icebreaker activity at a staff meeting.

	Using an AI tool to help scheduling staff for shifts.	Uploading a donor's past giving to predict what amount to ask for the current year.

2. Hosting an all-staff conference-style AI training in January – staff select what they want to learn.

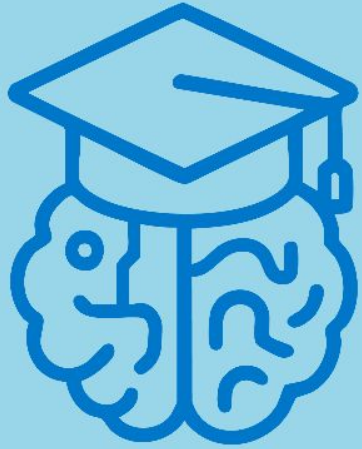


3. “Lunch and learns” – staff meet and share AI tools and techniques.

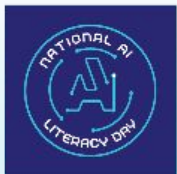


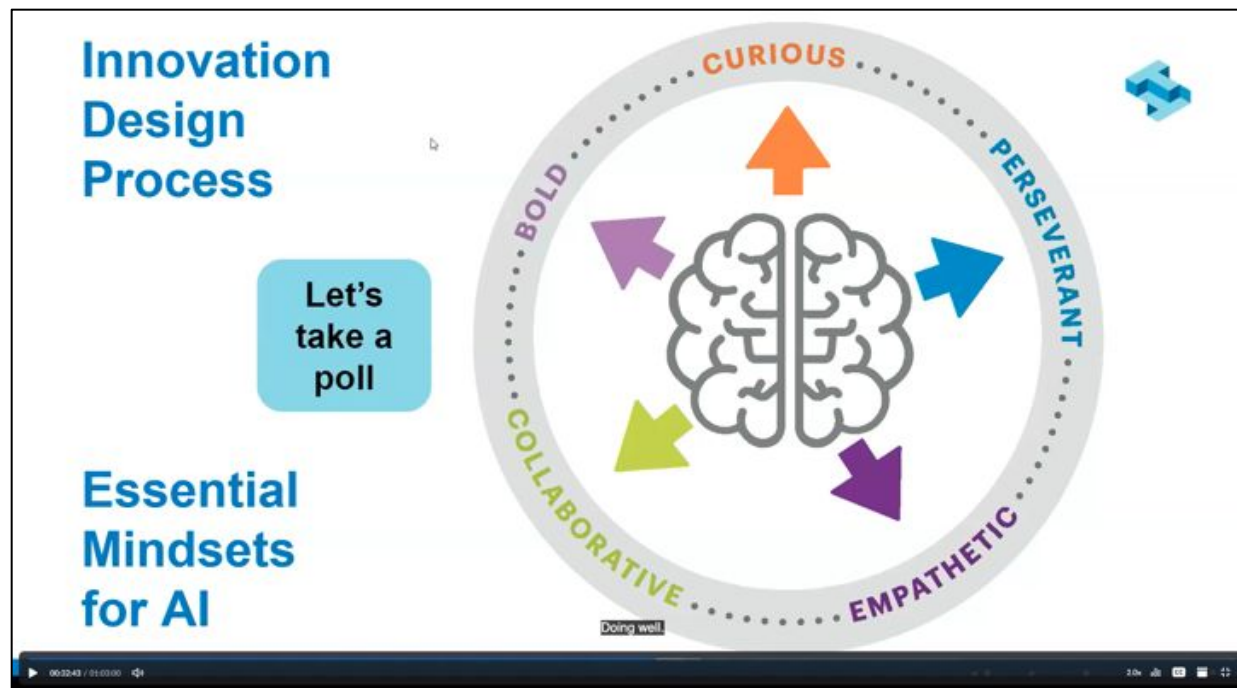
